

Many Will Join Bladensburg Historic Tour

Expect Scores of Students
to Take Part in Event
Next Sunday.

Scores of students of history are expected to take advantage of the Bladensburg points-of-interest tour, to be conducted at 2:30 p. m. next Sunday by the Bladensburg Historical Society.

Maps will be furnished the visitors at tour headquarters, to be set up at the Memorial Cross. Guides will be stationed at the sites to be visited.

There will be a charge of 50 cents for the tour. At the conclusion tea will be served at the Bostwick House in Bladensburg. Funds obtained will be used in the proposed restoration of the town.

Among the places to be visited will be Carlton Mill, George Washington Tavern, Ross House, the Magruder House, St. Luke's Church, Beall's Pleasure, Parthenon Heights, the Evans House and the Bostwick House.
